Northumberland, PA

Our Joseph Priestley District of the UUA is named for the Rev. Dr. Joseph Priestley. In the 18th century Priestley was one of the most famous people in the world. He was a scientist, historian and Unitarian Minister in England.

A rioting mob burned his home, library and laboratory in Birmingham. He and his family subsequently immigrated to the new United States of America. Long a friend of Thomas Jefferson and Benjamin Franklin, Priestley helped start the First Unitarian Church in Philadelphia, as well as the University of Pennsylvania. Then the family moved to Northumberland.

The Priestley home and laboratory in Northumberland is now a museum owned and kept open by the American Chemical Society. UUFHC Member Laurie Andes used to be a docent there. She read Priestley's religious and historical writing. That's why she and Jon came to our Fellowship!

The Priestley Chapel is owned and maintained by the Priestley Chapel Associates, a group of UUs and Northumberland townspeople.

We'll need to leave the Fellowship parking lot on May 19 at 7:30 am. It's a three hour trip. We'll tour the museum, have a service in the Chapel, then have a picnic at a State Park and be back home by 8:00 pm.
